ANZAC Day

ANZAC Day is held on April 25 and commemorates the first military action undertaken by Australian and New Zealand forces in the First World War as they landed at the shores of Gallipoli in Turkey. Over 60,000 Australians died in the First World War and Australians have since adopted April 25 as a day to remember the sacrifice these soldiers made for their country. Since that time, the commemoration on ANZAC Day has grown to include all Australians whose lives have been sacrificed in later wars. They are known as fallen soldiers. ANZAC dawn services are held across the country at the time the original troop landed at Gallipoli. Lest we forget.

2. Australians landed at Gallipoli on 25 April 1915 and were evacuated on 20 December 1915. How long were they there?

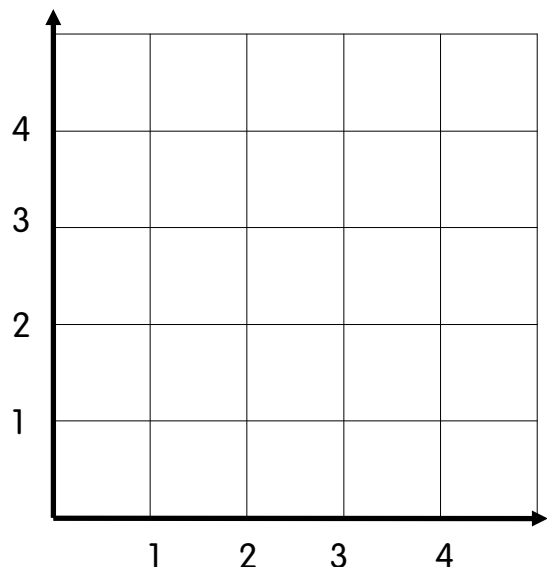
